Subject of Review:	Growing demand for agricultural commodities over the last decade has increased the incentives for farm operators to increase production. One way to expand production is through an expansion of cropland acres. However, another way to expand production is by intensifying production on existing cropland. One form of intensification is double cropping—the harvest of two crops from the same field in a given year. Increases in double cropping may substitute for expansions of cropland acreage, thereby limiting the negative environmental consequences sometimes associated with cropland expansion. In 2012, farmers in the U.S. double-cropped about 2.2 percent of cropland, or 8.7 million acres, slightly more than the long-run average of 8.2 million acres for the period of 1999 to 2012. This brief examines recent trends in double cropping, along with some of the factors driving its adoption.
