Subject of Review: Rice is one of the world's most widely cultivated and consumed crops, and the efficient operation of the rice market is a critical concern for global food security. Increasingly, low-grade rice (or broken rice), has increasingly become an alternative substitute for animal feed, industrial processing, and blending in consumer products. Most consumers around the world prefer full grain rice. The exception are a few countries in West Africa who have a preference for broken rice as food. How has the expansion of broken rice trade altered global markets? Did recent shifts in broken rice trade towards feed use in China crowd out food consumption in more food insecure regions like West Africa? To explore these questions, the study analyzes the emerging global markets for broken rice—for human food, animal feed, and industrial purposes—paying close attention to China as the largest importer of broken rice.
