Subject of Review: Prevented planting occurs when a farmer is unable to plant an intended crop, such as corn, due to reasons outside of the farmer's control, such as flooding. When this occurs, the farmer is left with the options of planting a different crop or leaving the land idle. The prevented planting of agricultural commodities can have implications for the accuracy of agricultural market projections and farm incomes. Moreover, payments for prevented planting are an important component of the U.S. crop insurance program, the primary source of farm support at the Federal level. This report provides background on the prevented planting component of the U.S. crop insurance program and examines temporal and spatial patterns in U.S. prevented planting acres. Patterns in U.S. prevented planting are presented for multiple crops and at the national, State, and County levels for several time periods. Special consideration is given to corn, soybeans, and wheat due to the shares of prevented planting acres attributable to these crops. Special consideration is also given to the Mississippi Portal region due to recent occurrences of prevented planting in that region.
