Subject of Review:	The majority hired farm workers employed in U.S. agriculture were born outside of the United States. An estimated 4 in 10 of crop workers, not employed on H-2A temporary work visas, lack legal work authorization. Since the 1980's immigration reform bills have been repeatedly proposed in Congress with the stated aim to aid the nation's farmers secure an adequate workforce. The most recent example is the Farm Work Force Modernization Act (FWMA), which includes provisions that would extend legal work status to foreign-born individuals employed in agriculture who lack legal work authorization including: 1) temporary legal status as Certified Agricultural Workers (CAWs) and 2) a potential path to permanent residency for those who continue to meet certain criteria via their employment. Immigration reform legislation impacting farm workers, whether FWMA or a similar law, would have far reaching consequences for US agricultural producers. Using data from the Department of Labor's National Agricultural Workers Survey and the Bureau of Labor Statistics' quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, an estimated 267,000 to 533,000 undocumented crop farm employees would be eligible for CAW status, and an estimated 93,000 to 347,000 would be eligible for a green card (permanent residency) under the criteria defined in FWMA.
