Subject of Review: Southeast Asia is one of the world's most dynamic and diverse economic regions, and a promising overseas market for U.S. agricultural goods. The region is growing rapidly in terms of both gross domestic product (GDP) and population and is already the third largest regional market for U.S. agricultural exports. Southeast Asia's tropical climate produces plantation crops such as palm oil, rubber, tropical fruit, and fish, but the climate is not favorable for production of temperate region crops grown in the United States such as wheat, corn, soybeans, deciduous fruit such as apples and berries, and dairy products. Therefore, Southeast Asia has the potential to be an important overseas market for U.S. agricultural products, but it is also a coveted market for major competitors of U.S. agricultural products. This report analyzes trade data to determine historical trends, assess the potential of increasing the role of Southeast Asia as an export market for U.S. agricultural products, and to determine which countries compete effectively with the United States in the region.
