Subject of Review: An increasing global population—with changing diets and an increasing demand for animal-based products—and a changing climate puts pressure on the existing and future food supply. This is because a changing climate could lead to warming temperatures and the increased likelihood of extreme weather events such as droughts and floods, impacting agricultural productivity, in particular crop yields. Estimates from several pieces of research indicate that severe shifts in crop yields due to climate change could happen sooner (within the next 10 to 20 years) than previously projected. Lower crop yields could lead to lower agricultural productivity, which could impact agricultural production and ultimately food prices and food security. And this is at a time when incomes are increasing and leading to an increase in food demand—especially from meat, which uses crops as an input into production.
